

Hoover Historical Society Scholarship Award Information & Application for 2022

The Hoover Historical Society offers an educational scholarship for \$1,000 paid to an accredited two-or four-year college or university for tuition or other expenses. This one-time scholarship furthers our mission of promoting an increased awareness and knowledge of history. In addition, a scholarship for Skilled Trades is awarded to a deserving student from the Riverchase Career Connection Center (RC3).

- This collegiate scholarship is awarded to a deserving student at each of the two high schools in Hoover, AL—Hoover High School and Spain Park High School
- Letter describing the scholarship and application is sent to the College Guidance Counselors and Social Studies departments of both HHS and SPHS.
- The manner of selection involves screening by the Social Studies departments at each school, submitted to the guidance counselors, and forwarded to the Hoover Historical Society Scholarship Committee. This committee selects the finalist for each school.
- CRITERIA for selection:
Academic performance;
community service; *e.g.*, involvement in organizations & activities; and
a typed, double-spaced 1,000-word essay-using topic ‘prompts’ provided on this application.

The essay should include a title or topic; good grammar and spelling; and a citation of sources.

Application must be submitted to the student’s Counselor’s office by Friday, March 25th, 2022, or the Friday before Spring Break.

The HHS Scholarship Committee meets in April to select recipients of the Scholarship Award for this year. The scholarships are sponsored by individuals and businesses in the Hoover community and are named on the winner’s Certificate of Award.

Winners and counselors will be notified during April. If possible, awards will be noted at Honors Day ceremonies. Application form and 'prompts' are attached.

The past two years—2020 and continuing into 2022— the world has existed in a state of Pandemic—with shelter-at-home, lockdowns, and other governmental orders to slow the spread of COVID-19.

You have lived through a unique, historical experience. Reflect upon your experience(s) and write your essay from **one** of these viewpoints (and create a title/headline for your essay):

- 1. While under shelter-at-home orders, your daily activities changed dramatically. Education, home life, part-time jobs, extracurricular activities, sports, etc., had to ‘retool.’ What positive things came out of this experience? What positive things do you think will continue when the pandemic ends?
- 2. Ten years from now, how do you think you will describe this (Pandemic) experience? Will it change your life?
- 3. What is the responsibility of media outlets for providing truth in reporting? Does social media affect how we determine what is true online? Examples of misinformation include vaccines, mandates for both masks and vaccines, and other controversies. How will that impact the way history of the pandemic is recorded?
- 4. Write an ‘editorial’ for a newspaper using facts, data and other professional opinions in support of (or against) the lab-origin theory of Covid-19.
- 5. Any historical event in Alabama’s history.

ALL papers required a minimum of two sources—preferably only one of these from the Internet. Citation of sources should follow the document itself.
